Removes HDCP from the DVI-D output of the Denon 1910 DVD player

The HDCP-OFF for Denon 1910 completely removes HDCP from the DVI-D output of this DVD player.

The Denon 1910 DVD player is fitted with a DVI output, for a pure digital connection to a plasma or LCD display without any loss in picture quality.

This DVI output is protected with HDCP (High bandwidth Digital Content Protection), a copy protection scheme, added to prevent unauthorized copying.

The HDCP-OFF plug connects between the dvd player and display and switches off the HDCP protection in the DVD player.

Your DVD player will output a normal DVI 1.0 compliant signal. Compatible with all DVI enabled displays, switches and repeaters.
